PAIN MANAGEMENT

This course covers the proper administration of paracetamol and methoxyflurane to relieve pain. It includes information about the use, storage and documentation of administration as well as ongoing monitoring of the casualty.

Further training in the administration of Entonox is available upon request.

COURSE DURATION

Half a day of training and assessment.

CERTIFICATE

On successful completion of this course you will be issued a statement of attainment in:

- PUAEME005A Provide pain management

St John recommends that pain management skills are renewed every 12 months.

COURSE OUTLINE

This course covers:

- Revision of provide first aid
- Storage and documentation
- Pain management
- Analgesia

ASSESSMENT METHODS

A successful outcome for this statement of attainment will be determined by a range of different assessment methods including written assessment, observation of simulated and practical activities etc.

You will be required to demonstrate adult CPR on a manikin on the floor.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS/PREREQUISITES

You must hold a current statement of attainment in either:

- HLTAID003 Provide first aid
- OR
- HLTAID002 Provide basic emergency life support
